I have had the wonderful opportunity to have Tia in my Introduction to Public Health course at the University of North Carolina, Greensboro (UNCG) Department of Public Health Education and am very happy to speak to the qualities she has that speak to health education success: academic potential, interdisciplinary thinking, character, commitment to equity and what I have observed of her integrity and personal qualities.

Tia is a very personable and sincere person; professors occasionally look for go-to people who they rely on for assistance in classroom discussions and activities – Tia was one of my go-to
